
QUARANTINE AND CUSTOMS (REPEAL) ORDINANCE 2009

An Ordinance to repeal the Quarantine and Customs Ordinance

BE it enacted by the Administrator of the Sovereign Base Areas of Akrotiri and Dhekelia as follows:—

1. Short title

This Ordinance may be cited as the Quarantine and Customs (Repeal) Ordinance 2009.

2. Quarantine and Customs Ordinance repealed

The Quarantine and Customs Ordinance^(a) is repealed.

3. Commencement

This Ordinance comes into force on the day that it is published in the Gazette.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note does not form part of the Ordinance)

1. This explanatory note relates to the Quarantine and Customs (Repeal) Ordinance 2009 (“the Ordinance”). It has been prepared by the Office of the Attorney General and Legal Adviser in order to assist the reader of the Ordinance. It does not form part of the Ordinance.
2. The Ordinance repeals the Quarantine and Customs Ordinance. This is a colonial law enacted in 1901 and many of its provisions are now archaic. There is also some overlap with the Quarantine (Maritime and Aerial) Regulations 1953 (PI 677/53) made under the Quarantine Ordinance (Cap 260). To the extent that the provisions of the Quarantine and Customs Ordinance do not have any equivalence in the 1953 Regulations, this can be remedied when those Regulations are next amended.
